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
Step 1: Characterizing mother and daughter


Step 3: Evaluating the ending

- b) Listen to "Pleading Child" and "Perfectly Contented" from Robert Schumann's "Scenes from Childhood" (pieces nos. 4 and 5, you can easily find them on your favourite streaming service).
- c) Explain the last sentence of the short story in a short coherent text, considering the mood of the music as well as the titles of the two piano pieces.

Step 4: Being creative
